ORPHANS





- Last November we took in an **orphaned baby elephant e**stimated to be about 4 months old. The young elephant had been found wandering on his own with no sight of his mother or herd. Read more

- **Shawu** had been kept under the watchful eye of a team of curators and elephant keepers, as well as Lammie. Although looking after him is taxing in many ways, we've been pleased with his progress.



- Taking care of a baby elephant without its mother is a great challenge. Our **Shawu has** been experiencing some health problems and had to undergo a blood transfusion. Read more...
- Our well-equipped veterinary facility (with hospital and quarantine sections) allow us to be able to look after a variety of orphaned or physically compromised animals. This was once more put to the test when an **orphaned baby hyena** was brought to the centre at the end of December for temporary care. Read more
- We took in **an orphaned nyala calf,** whose mother was killed by a buffalo. This little one has been paired with the resident duiker, Bokkie Bok. Read more...
- Early in February we took in yet another **orphaned rhino.** This little one's story is no different to some of the rhino babies at the centre. She was found next to her dead mother's carcass.

CHEETAH UPDATES



- Our curators noticed some of the **cheetahs were shedding** off their hair; and to remedy this, they were treated with lime sulfur. Read more...
- Cheetah conservation is one of HESC's core disciplines. As one of two CITES-accredited institutions in South Africa, we strive to support conservation within the context of a sustainable ecosystem by focusing on the conservation of rare, vulnerable and endangered animal species. As a result, our cheetahs took part in DNA profiling conducted by the National Zoological Gardens of South Africa in order to investigate the pathology and potential genetic basis of oxalate nephrosis in cheetahs.
